- The impact on Business Aviation, service suppliers & FBO's in the UK will be ten fold during the London Olympics 2012.
- Planning will be key for efficiency and coordination.



Everybody wishing to travel in, over or through the UK during this period, be that connected or not to the Olympics need to be prepared.



Key points: scale of the Olympics

- Olympic Games 2012 will be held in London and across the UK from 27th July to 12th August 2012, followed by the Paralympic Games from 29th August to 9th September 2012.
- Tourists visiting the Olympics 2012 events predicted at almost a million and a potential spend in the UK of £2.34bn.
- 26 Olympic sports will be played.
- 32 competition venues will be utilised.
- 17,000 athletes will compete.

- 2,000 team officials will lead their athletes.
- 120 of Heads of State and VVIPs expected.
- 20,000 press/media will be in attendance.
- 60-70 London 2012 sponsors.
- 12 TOP IOC sponsors will participate.
- Which equates to about 70,000 members of the “Olympic Family” and sponsors will be in attendance.
- 600,000 plus spectators.



Main Olympic key dates:

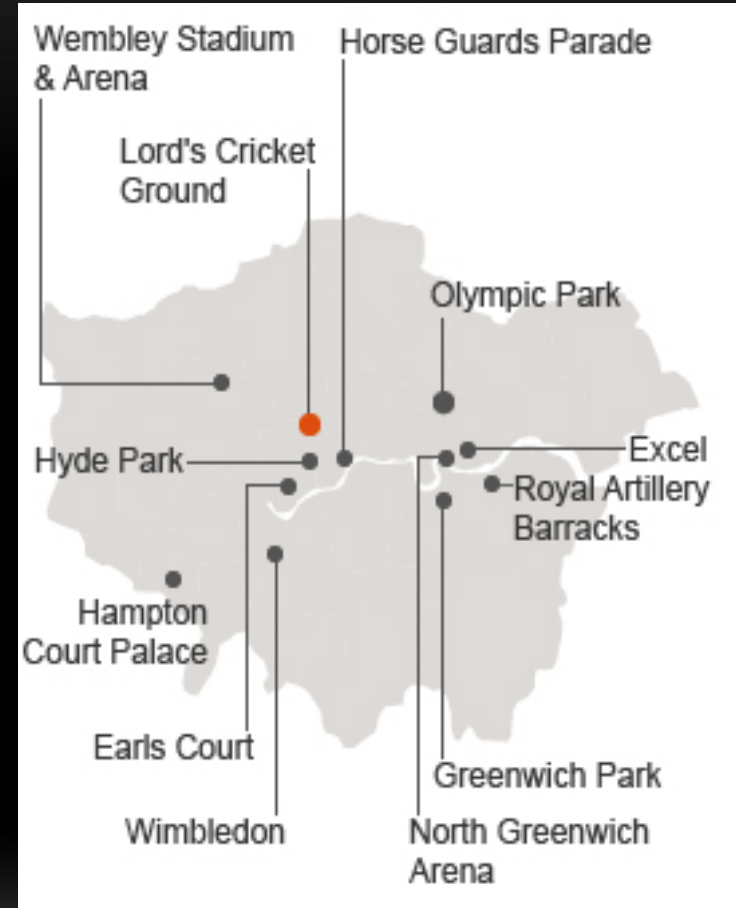
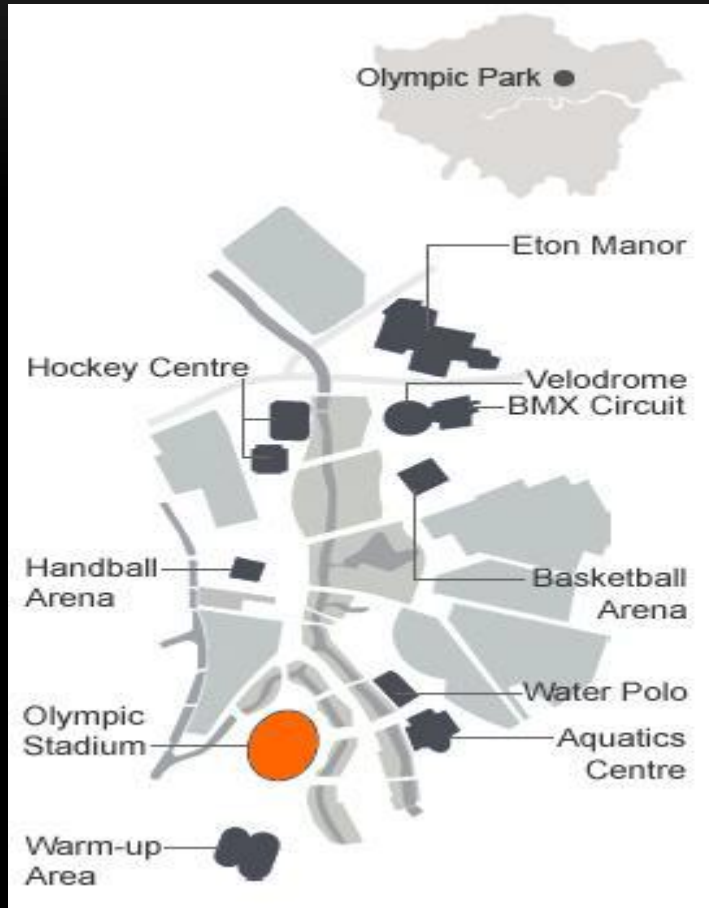
- 27th June 2012 Media arrivals
- 16th July 2012 Olympic village opens
- 27th July 2012 Opening ceremony
- 12th August 2012 Closing ceremony
- 13th August 2012 expected peak departures (67% estimated)

Record traffic for business aviation sector

- Expected to bring unprecedented levels of business aviation traffic to the London area - approximately 10,000 – 12,000 corporate aircraft movements.
- Over 3,000 additional flights in the peak 31-day period.
- Summer months of 2012 will witness some of the busiest periods of air travel ever experienced across London and the southeast of England.

- The two major airports of London Heathrow and London Gatwick will be closed for GA, Non-scheduled traffic during the games period. Planning will commence from 01st September at 40 southern UK airfields and airports. Details on these can be found further on in this brief.



Olympic Venues in London



Not all events are being held in the London area or at the Olympic Park

Pre-planning: Operators need to carefully review their objectives to determine which airport best fits their needs, be that location or convenience.

Over 26 sports – not all in London!

(32 venues across the UK, contesting 302 medal events, of which 10 venues are outside London contesting 91 medal events)

Airports Open for Slot Bookings

- All aircraft arriving or departing from the coordinated UK airports during the period 21st of July 2012 to the 15th of August 2012, inclusive and using controlled airspace will be required to have an arrival and/or departure slot.
- CAUTION – submitting/requesting a flight plan without a valid slot ID will ultimately result in the flight plan being cancelled on the day.
- CAUTION - All flight plan times must correspond exactly with the slot time requested/approved – ACL will cancel slots without notice and will strictly enforce this rule during 21st July – 15th August in particular.
- CAUTION - All unknown or unidentified activity will be intercepted. The UK RAF will be placing a military contingency at the UK Air Traffic Control HQ in Swanwick. This team will be monitoring all flight activity through the controlled zone during this period. Special sqwark idents will be issued to operators via approved means (Flightworx® can advise further on this).

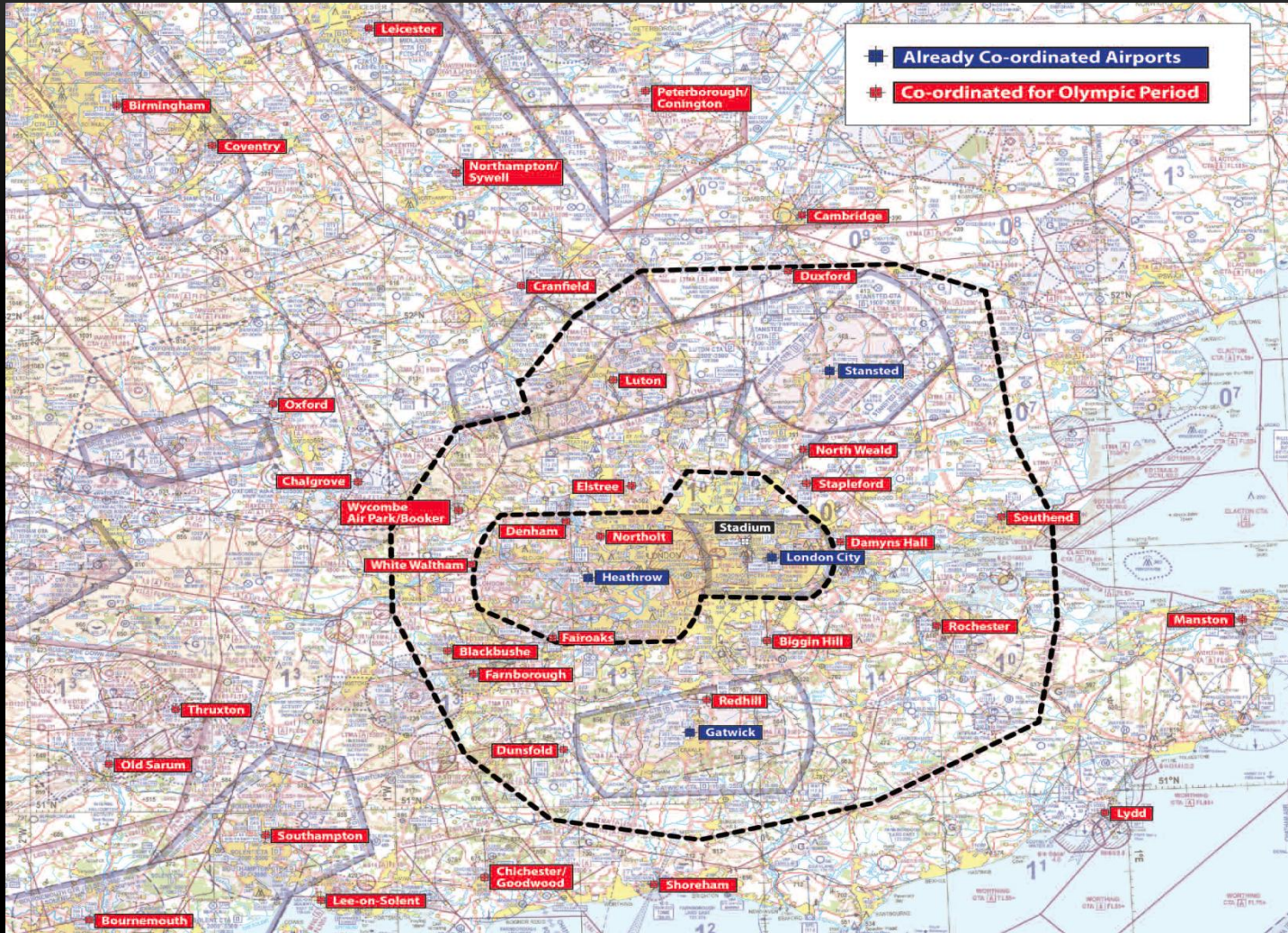
40 UK Airports will require Slot Bookings

Slots will be available to be booked with airports for non-scheduled operations during the Olympic period from the following dates:

- **5th September 2011:** Biggin Hill, Blackbushe, Cambridge, Chalgrove, Coventry, Cranfield, Damyns Hall, Denham, Dunsfold, Duxford, Elstree, Fair Oaks, Farnborough, Goodwood, Lee-on-Solent, Leicester, Lydd (London Ashford), London Oxford, Manston, Northampton, Northolt, North Weald, Old Sarum, Peterborough (Conington), Redhill, Rochester, Shoreham, Southend, Stapleford, Thruxton, White Waltham, Wycombe
- **30th November 2011:** Stansted, Birmingham, Luton, Bournemouth. (NB: Stansted, Luton and Birmingham will be open for provisional bookings from 1st September 2011).
- **1st February 2012:** Southampton, London City
- **CAUTION** – some UK airports and handlers will charge a non-refundable deposit for booking the slot and some other fees upfront (such as landing fee, handling charge). Be careful and clear when booking.
